#### A Note from our CEO:

In past newsletters I have thanked our many dedicated employees who work for VAC.

**Dedicated** is a key word in that statement because in today's work environment, it is rare to see employees who cross 15, 20 let alone 25 year anniversaries. On average, our employees have worked for VAC 8.6 years, more than twice the national average of 3.5 years for the social service sector. I want to recognize one of our employees who decided it was time to retire, after 25 years of service for VAC, Nancy Hicks.

Nancy joined VAC full-time as the site coordinator of our DeKalb Grove Street location. There she was instrumental in building new relationships and partnerships that strengthened the program and the agency as a whole. She soon took on the responsibility of oversight of other locations. When the decision was made to reduce service days at the Grove Street location, Nancy took on the responsibility as site coordinator for TSP, while still overseeing the Grove Street operations.

When ARRA funds became available, Nancy helped launch the community dinner program. This program provided dinner with all welcome. She coordinated volunteers and raised funds for it. (Unfortunately, the program had to end, long story). She was responsible for the very popular county-wide senior luncheon and helped plan the annual volunteer events. From poodle skirts to Halloween costumes, no matter the theme you could always count on her to dress the part. Nancy was an integral part of agency fundraising, including the golf outing and Meals for MOMs.

When COVID hit, Nancy joined the MOW team, eventually becoming the manager. She was instrumental in eliminating the waiting list and guiding the program through some very challenging times. Nancy also represented VAC in the community and with other providers. Each location Nancy took on became better. Nancy not only has given of her time she has been one of the most generous staff contributors.

Thank you Nancy for giving VAC your all for more than 25 years. We wish you well in your retirement.

One more employee I wish to recognize is Barb Nadeau. Barb has also decided to join the retiree crowd. For the past 5 years she has been the person behind the scenes developing and publishing these newsletters. Barb also started the much admired Bingocize program (an exercise program) for seniors at our Sandwich Fox Valley Senior Center. She has been involved in many community organizations in the Kendall County area, making sure VAC is represented. Thank you Barb and I wish you a wonderful retirement.





We are happy to show off the results of a process improvement collaboration with 3M and the Taproot Foundation, which has transformed their Sycamore Kitchen, the heart of the Meals on Wheels program.

To enhance the quality and efficiency of our meal services, VAC teamed up with 3M, for a 3M Impact Local partnership opportunity to provide our Meals on Wheels kitchen a process improvement analysis and recommendation. Under their guidance, VAC staff rearranged and streamlined elements in the kitchen to make it more functional, sustainable, and better equipped to serve nutritious meals to those in need.


"We worked directly with 3M workers on this 3M Impact Local project," said Amber Godinsky, Meals on Wheels Assistant. VAC's objective was to address capacity and consider how to create more efficiencies within the confines of our existing workspace. The 3M team analyzed the entire program from inventory trough production and staging for deliveries. The team of VAC and 3M staff met weekly through the fall months discussing strategies for maintaining meal temperatures longer, improving efficiency and doing more with the same number of resources, and to reduce congestion and improve workflow in the kitchen.

3M applied a 5S Lean Workplace model, Sort, Set in Order, Shine, Standardize, and Sustain, to VAC's production process, with staff planning what they need and how to organize and maintain the facility.

Their recommendations included freeing up workspace by removing excess utensils and supplies and rearranging the production line, reducing steps, and creating efficiencies in the process from cooking to packaging and staging for meal on wheels deliveries. "We were able to make these changes within the confines of a small kitchen at a relatively low cost," stated Nate Kloster, CEO. "They identified ways we could declutter and rearrange our workflow, helping us to relieve some of our growing pains in a kitchen that is too small for the volume of work we do here. 3M also provided a \$5,000 grant to help cover the cost of a few new pieces of kitchen equipment and expenses in moving electrical outlets," Kloster added.


"It has been exciting to see the collaboration. 3M has a huge business model, bringing them into something smaller like Meals on Wheels has been fun," Godinsky added. "3M asked our staff to be involved in the project, both the ideas, and the solutions."


After months of collaboration the project ended in December with participants meeting to discuss the project, and future. This collaboration exemplified a shared commitment to the well-being of the community. "We are grateful for their support and belief in our mission," Kloster


